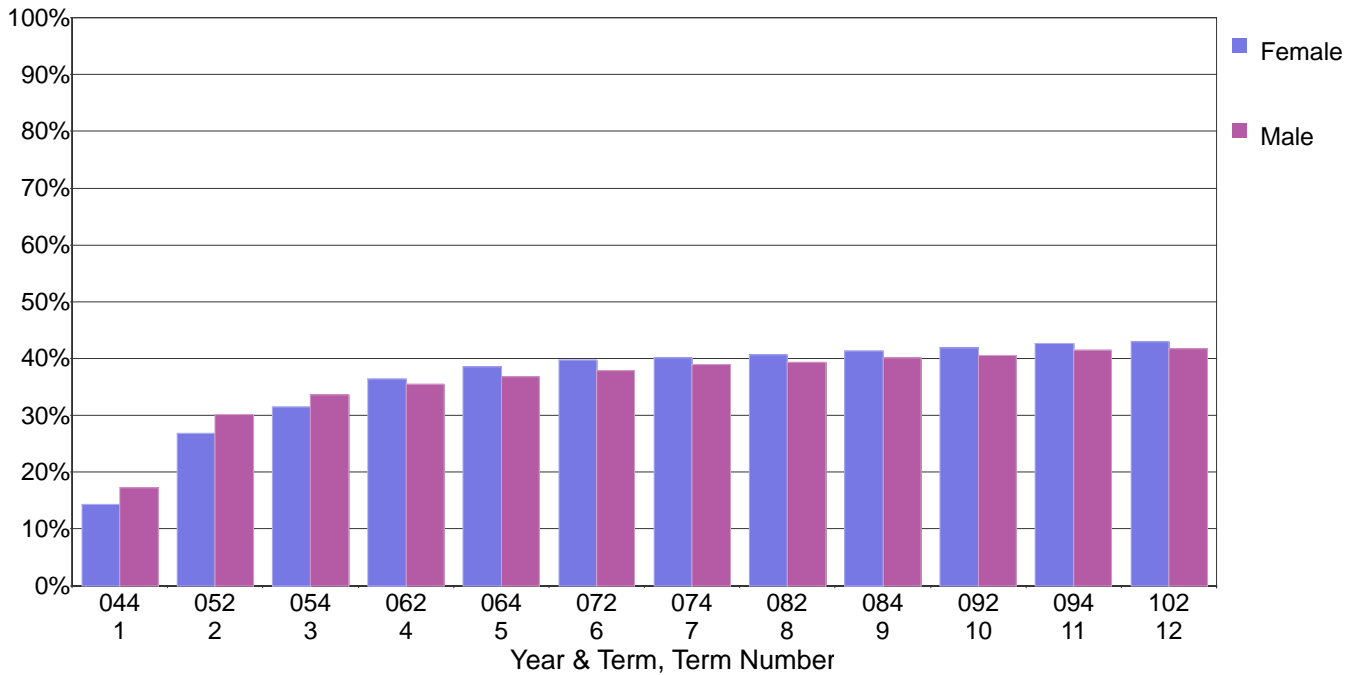

Note: The cohort is defined as all those entering in the fall of the indicated year who were enrolled on the census day and who had an enrollment status of first-time to college, i.e. enrollment status = 1. The filter for matriculating students was not applied. Thus, this cohort may include matriculation exempt students. A College Level Unit is defined as units earned (i.e., with a grade of D or better) in a class that does not have a Basic Skills flag of B (basic skills) or P (pre-collegiate).
